

# 30<sup>th</sup> Kingfisher Bay Resort Regatta



**27**<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> January 2023

After absences due to Covid and the flooding of Mary River, the Kingfisher Bay Resort Regatta made a welcome return to the Yacht Squadron calendar for the 30th-anniversary event on 27-28 January 2023.

Regatta competitors enjoyed sunny skies and generally light winds from east to southeast, with protected overnight anchoring in the lee of K'gari (Fraser Island). Crews, friends, and families enjoyed the excellent facilities of the resort. Tables were reserved in the Sand Bar as the hub for on-shore dining, socialising, race post-mortems, and prize presentations by a senior manager from the resort.

Eleven boats made up the fleet in cruising, monohulls, and multihull divisions.

After three close races and many changes of fortunes in the light and sometimes fickle winds, the overall regatta division winners were: Monohulls – Steve Cook and crew in the Noelex 25 Palomino; Multihulls – Tony Murray and crew in the F24 F-One-Eleven; and Cruising Tim Butters and crew in the Lightwave 10.5 Light and Salty.

The fastest outright mono in all three regatta races was David Lewis's Northshore 340 Curlew. The fastest outright multi in two of the three races was Daryl Dorsett's slippery Egan 8.2 cat Woody, with Gordon Myers' Grainger 075 Harmony fastest outright in the other.

On the first day, race one saw the fleet set off from near EU2 to Kingfisher Bay Resort observing the navigation marks down the Great Sandy Strait to the finish line near the Resort jetty. With generally light south-easterlies, genoas and screachers were a popular choice, and prayers of thanksgiving were said for the following tide.

On corrected time, Tony Richardson's F33 Pocahontas was the first multihull, Steve Cook's Noelex 25 Palomino the first monohull, and Brian Gillan's Noelex 25 Selkie the first cruiser.

Day two of the regatta consisted of a buoy race for monos and multis in front of Kingfisher Resort followed by a channel race to Wanggoolba Creek and back for all three divisions. Generally, light winds prevailed ranging from southwest to northeast They were fickle at times with big swings and holes, but ended the day with a 20-knot flourish.

In race two, first mono on corrected time was Adrian Perry's Noelex 25 Adrift. First multi on corrected time was Tony Murray's F24 F-One-Eleven.

In race three, the first mono on corrected time was Petra Berniger in the RL24 DK Ataraxia, and first multi on corrected time was Harmony. In the cruising division, the winner was Tim Butters in the Lightwave 10.5 catamaran Light & Salty.
