

# 29<sup>th</sup> Kingfisher Bay Resort Regatta Race Report

21st - 22th May 2021

The traditional Australia Day long weekend regatta in January was unfortunately postponed to May this year due to COVID19 and bushfires on Fraser Island. However, the annual Kingfisher Bay Resort Regatta has been a favourite for many sailors, and this year was no exception. The 2-day regatta saw a range of breezes but all from the south to south-east which resulted in Kingfisher Bay providing safe anchorage for the 5 yachts that made up the regatta fleet.

On the first day, Race 1 saw the combined fleet of monohulls and multihulls, set off from near EU2 to Kingfisher Bay Resort observing the navigation marks down the Great Sandy Strait. The south-easterly wind was moderately strong which took its toll on one competitor with a torn mainsail even before the start. The breeze was so strong that all boats elected to start the race with a reef in their mainsails which wasn't shaken out until they were in the lee of Fraser Island toward the end of the race.

Day two of the regatta consisted of a buoy race followed by a channel race to Wanggoolba Creek and back. The south-easterly winds proved challenging from light to heavy winds which were accompanied with sporadic rain squalls. The wind picked up again for the start of the channel race 3 and the whole fleet enjoyed a long beat to Wanggoolba Creek, followed by a fast broad reach back up the coast of Fraser Island to the finish.

Skippers and their crew were joined by their family and friends staying at the resort for the presentation night. All enjoyed the hospitality of Kingfisher Bay Resort with reserved tables at the Sand Bar. Winners were announced, and trophies and prizes were presented by representatives of the resort.

The overall winner of the Regatta and the Monohulls was *Curlew* skippered by Davis Lewis.

The winner of the Multihulls, Tony Murray skippered *F-One-Eleven (otherwise now known as 'Fill')* to win first place. The following table is of the scores and placings for the regatta.
